Wednesday, 20 November 2013

- 1 The Parliament met at ten o'clock a.m. pursuant to adjournment. The Speaker (Mr Theo Zurenuoc) took the Chair.

Absence of quorum: The Speaker reported to the Parliament that a quorum of Members was not present and announced that he would again take the Chair at the ringing of the Bells.

Suspension of sitting: At ten o'clock a.m., the Speaker left the Chair.

Resumption of sitting: At thirty minutes past ten o'clock a.m., the Speaker resumed the Chair, and a quorum of Members being present, and in accordance with Standing Order 34, invited Ms Delilah Gore (Member for Sohe) to say Prayers.

- 4 **HARBOURS (AMENDMENT) BILL 2013:** Mr Ano Pala (Minister for Transport) pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the *Harbours Act* (Chapter 240) to provide additional powers to the Head of State to make regulations, and for related purposes.
 Bill read a first time.
 Mr Ano Pala moved – That the Bill be now read a second time.
 Debate ensued

 And the question – That the Bill be now read a second time – was put accordingly, and passed – Bill read a second time
 Leave granted for the third reading to be moved forthwith.
 On the motion of Mr Ano Pala, the Bill was read a third time.
- 5 **INCLUSIVE EDUCATION FOR NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR COMMUNITY EDUCATION (REPEAL) BILL 2013:** Mr James Marape (Acting Minister for Education), presented a Bill for an Act to repeal the Inclusive Education for National Development for Community Education Act 2008.
 Bill read a first time.
 Mr James Marape, moved – That the Bill be now read a second time.
 Debate ensued
Closure: Mr Patrick Pruaitch moved – That the question be now put – put and passed
 And the question – That the Bill be now read a second time – was put accordingly, and passed – Bill read a second time
 Leave granted for the third reading to be moved forthwith.
 On the motion of Mr James Marape, the Bill was read a third time.
