Friday, 5 June 2015

The Parliament met at ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment. The Deputy Speaker (Mr Aide Ganasi) took the Chair.

Absence of quorum: The Deputy Speaker reported to the Parliament that a quorum of Members was not present and announced that he would again take the Chair at the ringing of the Bells.

Suspension of sitting: At ten o'clock a.m., the Deputy Speaker left the Chair.
